

**By Laws of the Rayson-Miller American Legion Post # 899,
Pittsford, New York,
Department of the State of New York**

PREAMBLE

For God and Country, we associate ourselves together for the following purposes: To uphold and defend the Constitution of the United States of America; to maintain law and order; to foster and perpetuate a one hundred percent Americanism; to preserve the memories and incidents of our associations in the Great Wars; to inculcate a sense of individual obligation to the community, state and nation; to combat the autocracy of both the classes and the masses; to make right the master of might; to promote peace and good will on earth; to safeguard and transmit to posterity the principles of justice, freedom and democracy; to consecrate and sanctify our comradeship by our devotion to mutual helpfulness to our Country, our communities and to our fellow veterans.

ARTICLE I

Name

The name of this organization shall be Rayson-Miller Post # 899, The American Legion, Department of the State of New York, hereinafter referred to as the "Post".

ARTICLE II

Objectives and Purposes

Section 1. The objectives and purposes of this Post shall be to promote the principles and policies as set forth in the preamble, and by the National and Department of the State of New York Constitutions of The American Legion.

Section 2. The purpose of these by laws, hereinafter referred to as the "By Laws", is to provide the rules of governance and the rules for conducting the business of the Post.

ARTICLE III

Nature of the Organization

Section 1. This Post is a civilian organization and membership therein does not affect or increase liability for military or police service.

Section 2. This organization shall be nonpolitical and shall not be used for the dissemination of partisan principles nor for the promotion of the candidacy of any person seeking public office or preferment.

Section 3. Rank does not exist in the American Legion and as such, no member shall be addressed by his/her military or naval title in any meeting of this Post.

ARTICLE IV Membership

Section 1. Eligibility for Membership

Any person shall be eligible for membership in Rayson-Miller American Legion Post # 899, Pittsford, New York who served in the Army, Navy, Marine Corps, Coast Guard or Air Force of the United States and assigned to active duty at some time during any of the following periods: April 6, 1917 to November 11, 1918; December 7, 1941 to December 31, 1946; June 25, 1950 to January 31, 1955; February 28, 1961 to May 7, 1975; August 24, 1982 to July 31, 1984; December 20, 1989 to January 31, 1990; August 2, 1990 to the date of cessation of hostilities as determined by the Government of the United States; or any other set of dates for hostilities as set forth by the Government of the United States; all dates inclusive, or who, being a citizen of the United States at the time of his/her entry therein, served on active duty in the armed forces of any of the Governments associated with the United States during any of the said periods; provided, however, that such service shall have been terminated by honorable discharge or honorable separation, or continued honorably during or after any said periods; provided further, that no person shall be entitled to membership who, being in such service during any of said periods, refused on conscientious, political or other grounds to subject himself/herself to military discipline or unqualified service. Any person who served in the United States Merchant Marine at any time during the period from December 7, 1941 to August 15, 1945, these dates being inclusive, shall also be eligible for membership in Rayson-Miller American Legion Post # 899, Pittsford, New York.

Section 2. A person desiring to become a member of the American Legion and a member of this Post shall complete and sign a Form D12NET or equivalent American Legion Membership Application Form and comply with any listed terms and conditions that may be stated on the application and submit this form either to the Post Commander, Post Vice Commander, Post Sergeant-At-Arms, Post Adjutant or Post Finance Officer.

Section 3. There shall be no form or class of membership except for active membership, and dues shall be paid annually or for life. Membership shall lapse if annual dues are not paid within sixty (60) days of being due as specified in Article V.

Section 4. No person shall be a member at any one time of more than one American Legion post.

Section 5. Any member of this Post may be expelled for cause by a two-thirds vote of the Executive Committee after charges are preferred under oath in writing, and a fair hearing is conducted upon the same. Any member may be removed for cause to include, but not limited, to the following; (1) conviction for a felony; (2) engaging in activities that are unbecoming of a member of the American Legion; (3) engaging in activities that are detrimental to the American Legion; or (4) failure to adhere to the principles of the American Legion.

Section 6. No person, who has been expelled by another post, shall be admitted to membership in this Post without the consent of the expelling post, except that where such consent has been asked for and denied by such post, he/she may then appeal to the Executive Committee of the Department of the expelling post for permission to be admitted to membership in this Post, and shall be ineligible for membership until such permission is granted.

ARTICLE V
Finance

Section 1. The revenue of this Post shall be derived from annual membership dues and from such other sources as may be approved by its membership.

Section 2. The amount of annual membership dues shall be determined by the Post Commander and Post Finance Officer of the Post and approved by majority vote of the members present at a monthly meeting when approval of revised annual dues is put to a vote. Upon acceptance by majority vote as set forth herein, annual dues shall remain unchanged from year to year unless changed by majority vote of members present at future monthly meetings.

Section 3. The annual dues shall be collected by the Finance Officer and be sent promptly to the Treasurer/Finance Officer of the Department of New York.

Section 4. Annual dues shall be payable by members to Rayson-Miller American Legion Post # 899 no later than December 31st of each year for the succeeding calendar year. A member whose dues for the current year have not been paid by January 1st shall be considered as delinquent. If the member's dues are paid on or before February 1st, the member shall be automatically reinstated. If the member is still delinquent after February 1st, the member shall be suspended from all privileges. If the member is still under suspension on June 30th of such year, that person's membership in the American Legion shall be forfeited. A member so suspended or whose membership has been so forfeited may be reinstated to active membership in good standing by majority vote of the members present at the next regularly scheduled Post meeting and payment of current dues for the year in which the reinstatement occurs; provided, however, that the Post, Department, and National organizations may waive the provisions thereof, upon payment of dues for the year in which the reinstatement occurs, with reference to former members who have been prevented from payment of dues by reason of active military service.

Section 5. Members who choose to become Paid-Up-For Life members shall pay the lifetime dues according to age and may use the time payment plan to purchase such membership subject to the terms and conditions set forth in the American Legion Post Handbook. For this Post, this handbook resides with the Post Commander.

Section 6. The Post Commander, upon his own authority, may approve the payment of invoices for Post operating costs such as rent, insurance, licenses and certifications, supplies for functions and also miscellaneous payments of no more than \$100.00. All other expenditures require prior approval by majority vote of members present at a regular monthly meeting.

Section 7. The officers of the Post responsible for the receipt and disbursement of monetary funds, management of the Post's financial accounts and property shall only be the Post Commander and the Post Finance Officer. The Post Commander and the Post Finance Officer shall be bonded and indemnified in the performance of their duties handling the Post's monetary funds, managing the Post's financial accounts and managing the Post's property by means of insurance coverage purchased by the Post.

ARTICLE VI
Officers

Section 1. The Officers of the Post shall be the Post Commander, Post ~~Vice-vice~~ Commander, Post Sergeant-At-Arms, Post Adjutant, Post Finance Officer, Post Chaplain, ~~and~~ Post Historian and Post Service Officer (Added 11/20/2013).

Section 2. All officers shall be elected by the Post membership for a term of one (1) year. The start of the term of office shall be from the day after the June monthly meeting which is normally held on the fourth Tuesday of that month and the term will end on the day of the June monthly meeting during the following year. Responsibilities of officers of the Post shall be as called for in the National Post Officer's Guide and any other national publications, such as the Post Adjutant Manual and Post Chaplain's Guide except for those specific responsibilities described in the following sections of these by-laws. (Added 11/20/2013)

Section 3. Duties of the Post Commander

- a. Plans and develops agendas for monthly meetings and presides during these meetings.
- b. Plans Post operations and develops calendar of events for the coming year after assuming office.
- c. Interfaces with the Monroe County American Legion and the Regional American Legion.
- d. Interfaces with Town of Pittsford and Village of Pittsford officials.

Section 4. Duties of the Post Vice Commander

- a. Performs duties as delegated by the Post Commander.
- b. Assists the Post Commander in planning of Post operations and conducting events.
- c. Assumes the duty of commander in the Post Commander's absence or when the Post Commander is unable to fulfill his/her duties due to serious illness or injury.
- d. Assumes the office and duties of Post Commander upon the death, resignation or removal for cause of the Post Commander.

Section 5. Duties of the Post Sergeant-At-Arms

- a. Conducts ceremonial duties as set forth in The American Legion Officer's Guide and Manual of Ceremonies and as directed by the Post Commander.
- b. Is the acknowledged authority for the Post for Flag etiquette and of Title 4 of the United States Code pertaining to the Flag of the United States.
- c. Is the custodian of the Colors of the Post.
- d. Is the custodian of the Prisoner of War/Missing In Action banner belonging to the Post.
- e. Commands the Color Guard and Honor Guard and is responsible for recruiting their membership and availability for ceremonies, events and funerals.
- f. Is the chairman of the Membership Committee of the Post.
- g. Recruits personnel to support Post fund raising events.
- h. Renders reports of membership annually or when called upon at meetings or under direction of the Post Commander to handle any correspondence of the Post membership records required by the American Legion National Headquarters, American Legion Department of New York, or Department of New York's 7th District, or Monroe County.

Section 6. Duties of the Post Adjutant

- a. Records and maintains the minutes for the monthly meetings.
- b. Oversees the publication of the monthly Post newsletter and in coordination with the Post webmaster, assists in updating the Post website and ascertains that the information contained in that website is timely and accurate.

Section 7. Post Finance Officer

- a. Maintains the financial records of the Post.
- b. Is the custodian of the incorporation documents of the Post.
- c. Manages the Post checking account and signs and issues all checks for disbursements as directed by the Post Commander and by the Post membership as set forth in the monthly meeting minutes.
- d. Prepares the annual Consolidated Post Report (CPR) and after review and approval by the Post Commander, submits this report to the Monroe County Commander or his representative no later than the required due date.

Section 8. Post Chaplain

- a. Prepares and offers non-sectarian invocations, benedictions and other prayers as needed at Post monthly meetings and other gatherings, events and ceremonies.
- b. Sends cards of condolences and sympathy on behalf of the Post to families of deceased members and members' spouses.
- c. Sends get-well cards to Post members and their spouses who are hospitalized due to sickness or injury.
- d. Be of service to the bereaved survivors of deceased members and members' spouses.

Section 9. Post Historian. Maintains historical records pertaining to the Post and insures that they are properly organized and are a readily available reference for the Post and for others who have a legitimate need to obtain information from those records.

Section 10 Post Service Officer. Provides guidance to local veterans (Post Members or not) by bringing to the attention of all veterans and their dependents the rights and benefits granted them by law (Added 11/20/2013)

~~Section 10~~Section 11. Succession of Officers

- a. The Post Vice Commander shall be sworn in and assume the duties of Post Commander upon occurrence of one of the following events: (1) Removal of the Post Commander as set forth in these By Laws; (2) Resignation of the Post Commander before fulfilling his/her term of office; or (3) Death of the Post Commander during his/her term of office.
- b. Upon the assumption of duties of Post Commander, the vacant position of Post Vice Commander shall be filled by special election at the next scheduled monthly meeting. Election to fill the vacant position of Post Vice Commander shall be by majority vote of the members present at this meeting. There will be no voting by proxy during this type of election.
- c. The newly elected Post Vice Commander shall complete the remaining term of the out-going vice commander.

Section ~~11~~12. Removal of Officers

- a. Officers may be removed from office by two-thirds majority vote during any scheduled monthly meeting. Votes shall include members present and proxy votes received prior to such monthly meeting from absent members.
- b. Any officer may be removed for cause due to, but not limited, to the following reasons; (1) conviction for a felony; (2) engaging in activities that are unbecoming of an officer at any level of the American Legion; (3) engaging in activities that are detrimental to the American Legion; (4)

failure to adhere to the principles of the American Legion; or (5) failure to perform the duties of the office for which he/she is elected.

- c. Officers are removed effective upon two-thirds majority vote to remove from office.
- d. In the event of a vacancy(ies) in any of the offices other than Post Commander, nominations to fill the vacant position(s) shall be solicited from the membership at the next regular monthly meeting and elections to fill the vacant position(s) will be held during the next subsequent regular monthly meeting. There will be no voting by proxy during this type of election. The newly elected officer(s) shall complete the remaining term of the vacant office to which elected.

ARTICLE VII Election of Officers

Section 1. Elections

- a. Elections for offices of Commander, Vice Commander, Sergeant-At Arms, Adjutant, Finance Officer, Chaplain and Historian shall be conducted each year at the June monthly meeting.
- b. By the April monthly meeting of each year, the Post Commander shall appoint and commission a Nominating Committee to develop a slate of candidates for the offices of Commander, Vice Commander, Sergeant-At Arms, Adjutant, Finance Officer, Chaplain and Historian.
- c. The Nominating Committee shall present the slate of candidates to the Post membership at the May monthly meeting.
- d. Election for each office shall be by majority vote during the June monthly meeting. Votes shall include members present and proxy votes received prior to this meeting from absent members.
- e. Only members who meet eligibility requirements as set forth in these By Laws shall be permitted to vote during these post elections.
- f. Those members who are not able to attend the June monthly meeting and who meet the eligibility requirements for voting by proxy may submit proxy votes as set forth in these By Laws.

ARTICLE VIII Voting

Section 1. Voting Eligibility. All members who are current in their annual dues shall be eligible to vote during the election of officers and at all regularly scheduled meetings and at special meetings called by the Post Commander.

Section 2. Proxy Voting

- a. Post members who wish to vote during elections of officers during the regular annual June elections or for amendments to these By Laws or for ratification of these By Laws shall make every reasonable effort to attend the meetings designated for elections of officers, acceptance of amendments to these By Laws or ratification of these By Laws.
- b. Members who have physical disabilities that preclude them from attending the designated meeting, those members who experience an illness or physical injury that precludes them from attending the meeting and those members who will be away from home traveling on business or personal matters are eligible to submit proxy ballots. There are no other eligibility criteria for the submission of proxy ballot other than as specified herein.
- c. Proxy ballots for elections of officers during the regular elections in June of each year, acceptance of amendments to these By Laws and ratification of these By Laws shall be available on the

Rayson-Miller website prior to the designated monthly meeting. Those members who do not have access to a personal computer may request a proxy ballot be sent to him/her by contacting the Post Adjutant.

- d. For elections of officers, members eligible to submit a proxy ballot shall print this ballot, mark their choice of candidate for each office, print their full name on the ballot, sign the ballot and mail or deliver their completed ballot to the Post Commander. In order for their ballot to be effective for the election, mailed ballots and delivered ballots must be received by the Post Commander no later than 12:00 Noon on the day of the June monthly meeting.
- e. For voting for the removal of an officer or officers, members eligible to submit a proxy ballot shall print this ballot, mark their choice of "Yes" or "No" for each listed officer who has been proposed for removal from office, print their full name on the ballot, sign the ballot and mail or deliver their completed ballot to the individual listed on the ballot prior to the specified due date and time. The individual receiving such ballots shall not be an individual who has been proposed for removal from office but shall be the highest ranking officer of the Post who is not on the removal ballot. In order for their ballot to be effective during the voting, mailed and delivered ballots must be received by the listed individual no later than 12:00 Noon on the date indicated.
- f. For voting on amendments to these By Laws and ratification of these By Laws, members eligible to submit a proxy vote shall print this ballot, mark their choice of "Yes" or "No" for each listed amendment to these By Laws or mark their choice of "Yes" or "No" for ratification of these By Laws, print their full name on the ballot, sign the ballot and mail or deliver their completed ballot to the Post Commander. In order for their ballot to be effective during the voting, mailed ballots and delivered ballots must be received by the Post Commander no later than 12:00 Noon on the day of the designated monthly meeting for voting on amendments or ratification .

ARTICLE IX Committees

Section 1. Post Standing Committees. Standing Committees of this Post consist of the following:

- a. Post Executive Committee.
 - (1) The Executive Committee of the Post shall consist of the Commander, Post Vice Commander, Post Sergeant-At-Arms, Post Adjutant and Finance Officer.
 - (2) The Post Commander shall be the chairman of this committee
 - (3) A two-thirds majority of the Executive Committee shall consist of any four of the five members of the Executive Committee.
- b. Boys Scouts Committee
 - (1) This committee shall be the Post's liaison to the Boys Scout troop that is sponsored and supported by the Post.
 - (2) This committee shall represent the post as required and requested by the adult leadership of the Boy Scout troop during troop meetings and at special troop functions.
 - (3) The chairman of this committee shall be selected by the Post Commander.
- c. Boys State Committee
 - (1) This committee shall be the Post's liaison to the Monroe County Boys State chairman.

- (2) This committee shall be aware of all current guidelines and requirements for the selection of candidates to the Department of New York Boys State event held annually.
- (3) This committee shall be responsible for the interviewing of candidates to represent the Post at each annual Department of New York Boys State event and select the most qualified candidates and alternate candidates to represent the Post at each such event. The committee shall notify selected candidates and alternate candidates.
- (4) The committee shall represent the Post as required at any Monroe County pre-Boys State event functions involving the candidate(s) and their family(ies).
- (5) The chairman of this committee shall be selected by the Post Commander.

d. Baseball Teams Committee

- (1) This committee shall be the Post's liaison to the Post sponsored baseball team and the Post sponsored Junior baseball team.
- (2) This committee shall provide periodic status updates to the Post membership on the how well each team is doing in competitive play and shall provide game schedule information to the Post.
- (3) The chairman of this committee shall be selected by the Post Commander.

e. Graves Registration Committee

- (1) This committee shall maintain written records of the locations of graves of Pittsford resident sons and daughters who paid the ultimate sacrifice in service of their country while serving in the Armed Forces of the United States.
- (2) Each year prior to Memorial Day and Veterans Day, this committee shall visit each grave that is within a reasonable distance of the Town of Pittsford and place small handheld American flags at the graves of Pittsford residents who paid the ultimate sacrifice while serving in the Armed Forces of the United States.
- (3) The chairman of this committee shall be selected by the Post Commander.

f. Membership Committee

- (1) This committee shall receive the listings from Department of New York State Post # 1 of their members who live in the Town of Pittsford and shall be responsible for recruiting these persons to become members of this Post.
- (2) This committee shall actively recruit eligible veterans for membership in this Post.
- (3) The chairman of this committee shall be ~~the Post Sergeant at Arms~~selected by the Post Commander. (changed 2/26/2014)

g. Publicity Committee

- (1) This committee shall be the liaison to the media for publicity for the Post and its events.
- (2) The chairman of this committee shall be selected by the Post Commander.

h. Finance Committee

- (1) This committee shall be responsible for periodic review of the financial status of this Post and will develop the annual operating budget plan.
- (2) This committee shall consist as a minimum of the Post Commander, Post Vice Commander, Post Finance Officer and a chairman.

- (3) The chairman of this committee shall be selected by the Post Commander.
- (4) Any member of the Post is welcome to join and participate in this committee.

i. Website Committee

- (1) This committee shall be responsible for maintaining the Post website and updating the Post website with the latest information and publishing the Post Newsletter after review by the Post Commander.
- (2) This committee shall consist of the Webmaster, who is also the chairman, and who will be assisted by the Post Adjutant and any other Post members as may be required from time-to-time in order to keep the Post website updated with the latest information.
- (3) At the request of the Commander or Adjutant to forward information to Post members, and with any assistance required by them or others, the Webmaster shall update the Post website whenever appropriate and publish the Post newsletter monthly in a timely and accurate way following timely review by the Post Commander and Post Adjutant. The Webmaster shall edit any input for clarity, spelling and grammar as far as is practical and appropriate. When appropriate, time sensitive information may be sent directly to Post members by means of email in the interest of timeliness. Email will also be used to inform members of the Post and Auxiliary, and friends and associates of the Post (e.g. town and village key personnel, scouting and baseball officials) of updates to the Post website. The newsletter will be mailed via the U.S. Postal Service to those members who not have email service.
- (4) The Webmaster, with cooperation and input from the Post Treasurer, shall maintain the primary copy of the Post membership list, email distribution lists, and mailing labels which are used for U.S. Postal Service mailings.
- (5) The Webmaster, with the assistance of others, as needed, shall take or arrange to have taken photographs of the various Post events and post these photographs on the website and/or publish them in the newsletter as appropriate.
- (6) The chairman of this committee shall be selected by the Post Commander. (Added 3/24/2014)

j. Ad Hoc Committees

- (1) The Commander may also from time-to-time, as needed, direct formation of additional committees to coordinate or oversee special activities, develop slates of candidates for elections or to investigate and propose resolutions to issues that may arise from time-to-time.
- (2) The chairmen of such committees shall be selected by the Post Commander.

ARTICLE X Monthly Membership Meetings

Section 1. Monthly membership meetings shall be held during the calendar year on the fourth Tuesday of each month or due to matters of convenience for the membership, on any such date for any particular month as may be decided and communicated by the Post Commander.

Section 2. Monthly meetings shall be conducted as set forth in the current edition of The American Legion Officer's Guide and Manual of Ceremonies. Roberts Rule of Orders shall be the guide for discussion and debate during monthly meetings.

ARTICLE XI
Auxiliaries

Section 1. This Post recognizes an auxiliary organization, known as the Rayson-Miller American Legion Post # 899 Auxiliary.

Section 2. Membership in the Rayson-Miller American Legion Post # 899 Auxiliary shall be limited to the mothers, fathers, spouses, significant others, daughters, sisters, granddaughters, great-granddaughters and grandmothers of all men and women who were in the Armed Forces of the United States during any of the following periods: April 6, 1917 to November 11, 1918; December 7, 1941 to December 31, 1946; June 25, 1950 to January 31, 1955; February 28, 1961 to May 7, 1975; August 24, 1982 to July 31, 1984; December 20, 1989 to January 31, 1990; August 2, 1990 to the date of cessation of hostilities as determined by the Government of the United States; or any other set of dates for hostilities as set forth by the Government of the United States; or who served in the United States Merchant Marine at any time during the period from December 7, 1941 to August 15, 1945; all dates inclusive or who, being a citizen of the United States at the time of his/her entry therein, served on active duty in the armed forces of any of the Governments associated with the United States during any of the said periods, and died in the line of duty or after honorable discharge; and to those women who of their own right are eligible for membership in this Post or any other post of the American Legion.

Section 3. The Rayson-Miller American Legion Post # 899 Auxiliary shall be governed by such rules and regulations as may be prescribed by the National Executive Committee of the American Legion and thereafter approved by the Department of New York of the American Legion.

ARTICLE XII
Dissolution

Section 1. This Post may be dissolved by either of the following actions: (1) approval by majority vote of two-thirds of the voting membership; and (2) as directed by either the National American Legion, State, Regional or Monroe County American Legion due to this Post falling below the minimum membership thresholds prescribed by the National American Legion.

Section 2. Upon dissolution of this Post, all remaining funds and property shall be transferred as directed by either the National American Legion, State, Regional or Monroe County American Legion.

ARTICLE XIII
Amendment of these By Laws

Section 1. These By Laws are adopted subject to the provisions of the National, Department of New York, New York 7th District, and Monroe County Constitutions and By Laws. Any amendments to said National, Department, District or County Constitutions and By Laws which conflict with any provisions hereof shall be regarded as automatically repealing or modifying the provisions of these By Laws to the extent of such conflict.

Section 2. Motions for amendment to these By Laws may be introduced at any monthly meeting. The motion(s) shall be reduced to writing and communicated to the membership on both the website and in the monthly newsletter.

Section 3. Voting on the proposed amendment shall be held during the next scheduled monthly meeting.

Section 4. Amendments shall be adopted by two-thirds majority vote during the monthly meeting designated for voting on this/these amendment(s). Votes shall include members present and proxy votes received prior to this meeting from absent members.

Section 5. Those members who are not able to attend the designated monthly meeting and who meet the eligibility requirements for voting by proxy set forth herein may submit proxy votes as set forth in these By Laws.

Section 6. Only members who meet eligibility requirements as set forth in these By Laws shall be permitted to vote on amendments to these By Laws.

ARTICLE XIV
Ratification of these By Laws

Section 1. Ratification of these By Laws shall be by majority vote during the monthly meeting designated for ratification of these By Laws. Votes shall include members present and proxy votes received prior to this meeting from absent members.

Section 2. Those members who are not able to attend the designated monthly meeting and who meet the eligibility requirements for voting by proxy may submit proxy votes as set forth in these By Laws.

Section 3. Only members who meet eligibility requirements as set forth in these By Laws shall be permitted to vote for ratification of these By Laws.

Section 4. Upon ratification, these By Laws shall supersede any previous by laws, constitutions or any other rules of governance for this Post that may have been previously ratified and in force for this Post.

ARTICLE XV
Membership Ratification of these By Laws

Section 1. The below named officers of this Post certify by their signing that these By Laws were ratified in accordance with the provisions of Article XIV of these By Laws on the 27th day of March 2012 and therefore are in effect.
